## Dear Parent/Carer,

Curriculum is at the heart of what we do at Tanfield School. The curriculum at Tanfield has been carefully sequenced to build powerful knowledge and application of that knowledge to support all students to achieve their sentence. To support conversations with your child about their subjects, please find an outline of the curriculum in each subject for the current Cycle 3. The information shared in this letter can also be found on the curriculum section of the website.

Each Cycle is 13 weeks and in week 7, we will revise in lessons to prepare for assessments in weeks 8 and 9. Students have received their Cycle 3 Knowledge Organisers. Students have been asked to keep their Cycle 1 and Cycle 2 Knowledge Organisers at home to support revision for Cycle 3 assessments. The homework students complete support learning of core knowledge and practise the recall and application of that knowledge. Please refer to the letter on Assessment Week and How to revise effectively for information on the assessments and revision support. For Y11, formal external assessments commence in May and all work, in school and at home, will focus on revision and completing practice papers.

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
