

Dear parent/carer,

I hope you and your families are well.

I thought it would be useful to give you an update on the current situation. As you will be aware, Ofqual released their arrangements for this summer's exam results. In summary, we have been asked to do 2 things for each of our students:

First, to make a judgement about the grade that each student was most likely to have achieved, if they had taken their exams in summer 2020.

Second, to rank each student relative to others who we also judge would have got the same grade. For example, if we judge that 8 students would have been most likely to achieve a grade 4, we need to rank those 8 students from 1 (the most secure/most likely to achieve the grade) to 8 (the least secure/least likely).

Before the Easter holidays we were continuing to teach students so that we could gain additional evidence to help us make our decisions. Unfortunately, the guidance from the DfE and Ofqual states that we should no longer do that.

I realise that it is difficult for students to get motivated to login to lessons, when the work they are doing is no longer going to count towards their final grade. Therefore, from Monday we will not expect students to follow their normal timetable.

However, it is important for students to realise that we are still there for them. They are still part of TeamTanfield and always will be. Therefore, we want to support them over the coming months, to ensure they are in the best possible position for their next steps. Some staff are going to continue teaching but focus on bridging units to A-levels in their subject, as well as completing their GCSE courses. These teachers will be in touch with your child about the timing of these sessions.
